ABOUT OUR PROJECT

The project "Kids in nature" aims to improve children's ecological understanding and physical health. During the project, each participant country organizes short-term training and good practise sharing events according to the 6 project themes. In total, 6 short-term cooperation training events are planned in the project, each event consist of learning courses (seminars, discussions, etc.) and practical trainings (visits to kindergartens, active work with children, etc.).

OUR TASKS:

- Organize staff training, where the participants will be equipped with competencies for the effective execution of project activities.
- Use nature as a learning environment: introduce children to the different elements of nature and their interactions and to allow kids to observe the cycles of nature up close.
- Cooperate with teacher partners and create a teaching methods related to learning about nature and in nature.
- Create eTwinning project to share and promote our common goals.
- Include parents and other stakeholders in to project activities.

During the first term of the project, the participating teachers have been actively creating and sharing their ideas and activities through a variety of channels. By providing teachers with the necessary tools and resources to inspire a greater understanding and appreciation of nature among young children, the project is on track to achieving its goal of fostering a lifelong love of the natural world.

In September 2022 we have fully completed the first part of "Kids in Nature" project.


Project started with a very unexpected challenge - worldwide quarantines due to Covid-19 due to which the partners have agreed to extend the project for another year.

Over the past two years of our Erasmus+ project, we have held a number of communication events in our partner kindergartens to facilitate the exchange of knowledge and ideas. The events have included teacher training workshops, parent information sessions, and cultural exchange activities. We have also used online communication tools, such as video conferencing and group chat platforms, to stay connected with our partner kindergartens.

SHORT-TERM STAFF TRAINING

During the 1st project year we've held 3 scheduled LTT (Learning Teaching Training) activities. Each short-term training and good-practice sharing event hosted 2 participants from each partner country and unlimited participants from a host country. The activities were planned around one of the project themes.

OUR THEMES:

- **A Path to Nature**, host country - Turkey;
- **Gardening for Bee-friendly Gardens**, host country - Lithuania;
- **From Garden to Table**, host country - Latvia;
- **Trees, Plants and Edible Wilds**, host country - Romania;
- **Animals in Natural Cycles**, host country - Slovenia;
- **Sustainable Nature Education at Kindergartens**, host country - Bulgaria.

Short-term LTT activity in Menekşe Ahmet Yalçınkaya kindergarten

In September 2021 partners were able to attend the first mobility event which was hosted by Turkish partner - Menekşe Ahmet Yalçınkaya kindergarten in Kırşehir city, Turkey.

4 day long teacher training program offered a concentrated and immersive experience for educators looking to expand their expertise and learn new strategies for the classroom.

A PATH TO NATURE

During the training, teachers participated in a variety of workshops that presented learning games and activities focused on nature and the environment. There were also discussions and job shadowing sessions where participants could learn from experienced educators and observe their teaching practices.

In addition to these learning opportunities, participant teachers had the chance to design own outdoor activities and take part in cultural trips in the beautiful region of Cappadocia, Turkey. This unique opportunity allowed participants to experience the culture and natural beauty of this fascinating part of the world while also gaining valuable skills and knowledge as a teacher.

Short-term LTT activity in "Volungele" kindergarten, Alytus, Lithuania

In May, 2022 a group of dedicated partner teachers met for the second time to share good practices and expand their knowledge around the "Bee-friendly gardens in kindergarten" theme.

The teachers were excited to learn from each other and to gain new ideas for incorporating bee-friendly gardens into their curriculum.

GARDENING FOR A BEE-FRIENDLY GARDENS

During the event partners observed educational activities about the bees and bee-keeping outdoors, had a work session about Project Based Learning (PBL) methodology with practical examples from "Volungele" kindergarten, visited the ancient Hollow Bee-Keeping museum and tried beeswax candle casting. Moreover, partners visited community-based outdoors school-kindergarten Melkys, where the alternative to traditional learning was presented.

Also, partners got to know Lithuanian partner kindergarten "Volungele" a little better: they met the team of teachers; observed the methods and methodologies used and how the indoor and outdoor spaces are used in the education process.

Short-term LTT activity in Daugavpils 13th preschool educational institution "Sunny bunny".

In June, 2022 a group of teachers from partner kindergartens gathered for a meeting to exchange ideas and share good teaching practices involving gardening with children and learning about the origins of food.

FROM GARDEN TO TABLE

The main focus of the meeting was on how to incorporate gardening and food education into the classroom curriculum. The teachers discussed various strategies for teaching children about the importance of healthy eating and the benefits of growing their own food. They also shared their own experiences and successes in using gardening as a tool for teaching subjects such as science, math, and language.

In addition to the gardening and food education, the event also presented an opportunity for the teachers to learn more about Latvian culture and heritage. Through presentations, lectures, and interactive activities, the teachers were able to deepen their understanding of Latvian history, folk art and customs, which they could later replicate to the pupils.

The "Kids in Nature" Erasmus+ project promises to be an exciting and valuable opportunity for young children to learn about wild nature and animals in a fun and interactive way.

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
